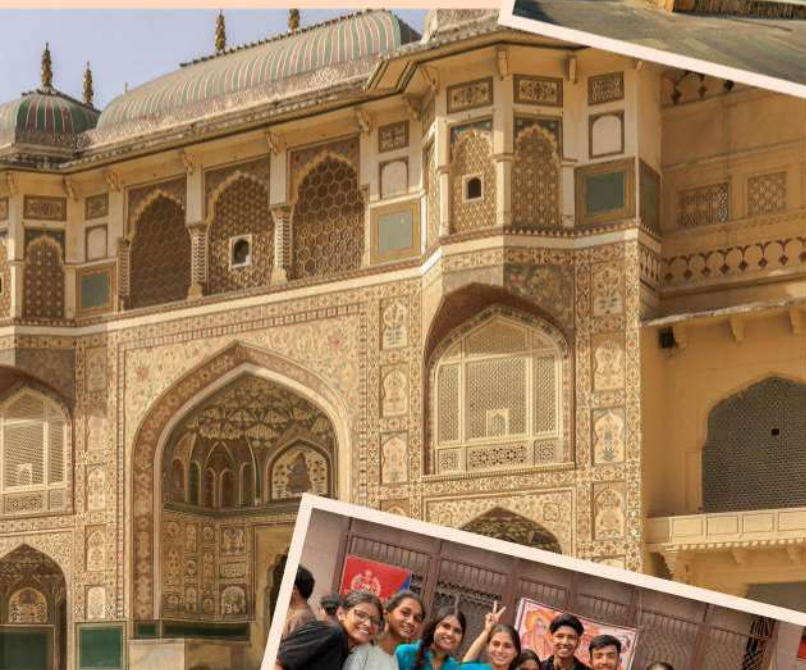


JAIPUR

3 DAYS



Day 0 - Departure Day

- 04:00 PM - Assembly at Chandigarh Railway Station
- Group assembly with safety briefing, document verification, and journey preparation. Ensure all students have valid school IDs for monument discounts.
- 06:50 PM - Board Overnight Train
Board evening train with separate coach arrangements for boys and girls. Journey discipline and train travel experience training.

Day 1 - Amber Fort and Heritage Palaces

- 06:25 AM - Arrival in Jaipur
Early morning arrival with coordinated hotel transfer and responsibility training for students

EDUCATIONAL FOCUS:

Rajput-Mughal architectural synthesis, construction techniques using pale yellow and pink sandstone with white marble, and strategic fort design.

HIGHLIGHTS:

Amber Fort and Heritage Palaces, Ancient Science and Traditional Crafts, Strategic Architecture and Departure

- 07:30 AM - Check-in and Fresh Up
Heritage hotel check-in with personal hygiene and time management focus.
- 09:00 AM - Breakfast at Hotel
Group breakfast with nutrition awareness and traditional Rajasthani cuisine introduction.
- 11:00 AM - Amber Fort Visit (3.5 hours)
Comprehensive guided tour of this UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Students will explore:

- Sheesh Mahal (Mirror Palace) - Intricate mirror work with hundreds of tiny mirrors creating stunning reflections
- Diwan-i-Aam - Hall of public audience showcasing Mughal court traditions
- Jaleb Chowk - Main courtyard where armies displayed their victories
- Sukh Mandir - Cool palace demonstrating ancient air conditioning techniques
- Underground tunnels connecting to Jaigarh Fort (partially restored and open to public)

Educational focus on Rajput- Mughal architectural synthesis, construction techniques using pale yellow and pink sandstone with white marble, and strategic fort design.

- 02:30 PM - Lunch at Hotel

Group discussion on fort architecture and reflection on morning learnings.

- 05:00 PM - Hawa Mahal and City Palace (2.5 hours)

Visit the iconic Palace of Winds and royal residence complex:

Hawa Mahal - The five-story palace with 953 small windows (jharokhas). Students learn about:

- Ventilation engineering - How the palace naturally cools through wind flow
- Royal women's lifestyle - How the lattice design allowed observation of street life while maintaining privacy
- Architectural innovation - Combining functionality with aesthetic beauty
- City Palace - Explore the sprawling royal complex with Indo-Saracenic architecture:
- Museum collections with royal artifacts, weapons, and manuscripts
- Chandra Mahal - Seven-story palace still housing the royal family
- Mubarak Mahal - Textile and costume museum

- 08:00 PM - Dinner

Rajasthani cuisine appreciation with cultural context and regional specialties.

- 09:30 PM - Cultural Evening

Folk culture presentation, team-building activities, and preparation for astronomical observatory visit.

Day 2 - Ancient Science and Traditional Crafts

- 06:00 AM - Early Wake-up Call
Discipline and punctuality training for comprehensive educational day.
- 07:30 AM - Breakfast
Healthy breakfast habits and energy preparation for extensive learning activities.
- 10:00 AM - Jantar Mantar and Albert Hall Museum (3 hours)



Visit two significant educational landmarks:

- Jantar Mantar - UNESCO World Heritage Site and astronomical marvel:
- Samrat Yantra - World's largest stone sundial (73 feet tall) for calculating local time
- Jai Prakash Yantra - Instrument for tracking celestial positions
- Ram Yantra - Cylindrical structures for measuring altitude and azimuth of celestial objects

Built by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II (1724-1734) combining Indian, Islamic, and European astronomical knowledge

Students engage in hands-on learning: Using smaller replicas to calculate time and understand ancient scientific methods.

Albert Hall Museum - Indo-Saracenic architectural masterpiece:

- Egyptian mummy and international artifacts showing cultural exchanges
- Traditional Rajasthani crafts including pottery, textiles, and jewelry
- Geological specimens and natural history collections



- 01:00 PM - Lunch

Museum artifact interpretation and discussion on scientific innovations.

- 03:00 PM - Handicraft Workshop and Johari Bazaar (2.5 hours)

Immersive cultural learning experience:

Traditional Craft Workshop - Hands-on experience in:

- Block printing - Learn centuries-old textile printing techniques
- Blue pottery - Understanding traditional ceramic art unique to Jaipur
- Miniature painting or jewelry making depending on group preference

Johari Bazaar Shopping - Educational market visit focusing on:

- Gemstone trade and traditional commerce understanding
- Local economics and artisan livelihoods
- Bargaining skills and cultural interaction

- 06:30 PM - Return to Hotel

Travel coordination skills and reflection on craft learning experiences.

- 08:00 PM - Dinner

Regional cuisine diversity appreciation with cultural dining etiquette.

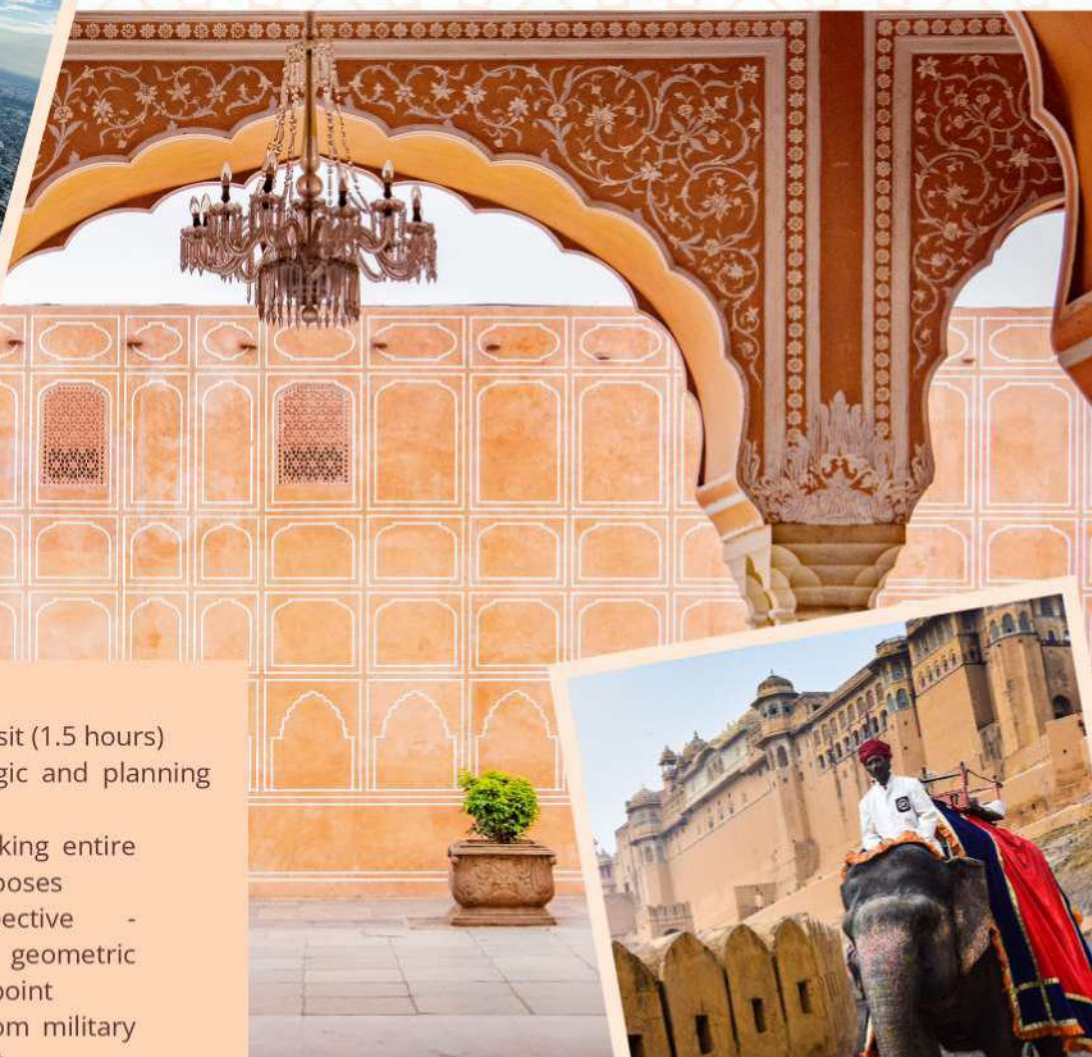
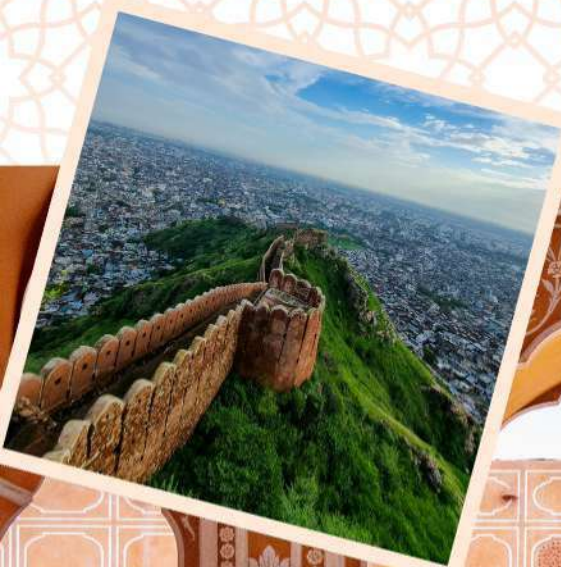
- 09:30 PM - Evening Activities

- 07:30 AM - Nahargarh Fort Visit (1.5 hours)
Visit the "Tiger Fort" for strategic and planning education:

- Strategic location overlooking entire Jaipur city for defense purposes
- City planning perspective - Understanding Jaipur's geometric layout from elevated viewpoint
- Architectural evolution from military fortress to pleasure retreat
- Panoramic city views providing geography and urban development lessons
- 09:00 AM - Local Market and Souvenir Shopping (2 hours)

Final cultural immersion focusing on:

- Local commerce and traditional business practices
- Cultural shopping with budget management skills
- Artisan workshops and small-scale industry understanding
- 01:00 PM - Lunch and Departure Preparation
Budget management discussion, social interaction skills, and journey reflection.
- 03:00 PM - Board Return Train
Begin overnight journey back to Chandigarh with cultural synthesis reflection and future planning
